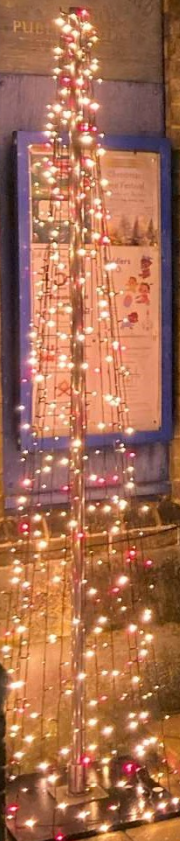

At the end of 2023 the Bishop of Oxford gave his blessing to an order to combine the three separate parishes in central Windsor moving from three governance bodies back to the historical one. From around 1100 AD when the original Parish was created, the town of 'New Windsor' (to distinguish itself from the more ancient 'Old Windsor') was quite small and required only one church, however, the population explosion in the early 19th century necessitated the creation of Holy Trinity in 1842, All Saints in 1863 and St Stephen in 1874. Over the last twenty years it became apparent these individual arrangements were a hindrance to mission, and we commenced the journey in 2019 to amalgamate and restore the historical structure.

Windsor is blessed with four Anglican churches which now sit in one parish led by the Rector of Windsor, Revd Canon Sally Lodge with His Majesty King Charles III as Patron. We are pleased to offer our Carols by Candlelight Services 2024 leading our union back to one Parish, uniting, as is our honour and privilege, the civilian and military communities of Garrison and Town who have co-existed for nearly 1,000 years.

Holy Trinity Parish & Garrison Church

Foundation Stone laid by Prince Albert
4 April 1842

Consecration by The Lord Bishop of Oxford
25 July 1844

Regarded as one of the finest Garrison Churches in the country, Holy Trinity has a dual role of serving as the Garrison Church of Windsor, the spiritual home of soldiers quartered in the town and as one of four Church of England churches serving our community.

Prince Albert, consort to Queen Victoria and whose life-size statue greets you at the West Door, laid the foundation stone in front of a 7,000 strong congregation and assisted architect, Edward Blore, with the design.

During the days of compulsory Church Parade over 400 parishioners and 1,400 soldiers would attend either Church Parade or Choral Mattins. Look around and you'll find the names of over 24,000 men from the Brigade of Guards, the Household Cavalry and the Household Division who are recorded in poignant memorials, none more so than those to the Boer, Crimean, North African and both World Wars. Among others, the Battle Standards of the Life Guards and the Coldstream Guards are laid up in in the Nave, still showing their marks of French musketry and sabres from the Battle of Waterloo. The Visitors' Book is a testament of the great who worshipped here, The King of Siam, Tsar Nicolas II, Empress Viktoria of Prussia, Winston Churchill but moreover those who served as many nameless soldiers whose name is known only by God.

In 1969, one year after the creation of the Household Division, the Colonel-in-Chief, Queen Elizabeth II, granted Holy Trinity the privilege to adopt the Division's Star and then in 1979, Lord Louis Mountbatten, Admiral of the Fleet, granted the honour to Holy Trinity to wear the Royal Navy White Ensign, which is flown above the pulpit.

Historical as it is, this is a place of quietness to reflect on God's mercy and forgiveness, a place of grandeur to offer praise and thanksgiving but primarily, a place for you, to encounter yourself and encounter the love of God.
